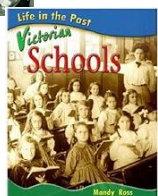
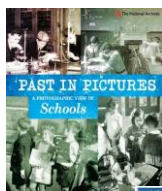
History

Star Words	Definition
Living Memory	Events that people who are alive today can remember.
Beyond Living Memory	Events that happened so long ago that nobody alive can remember them.
Primary Source	Evidence that something happened from someone who was there e.g. photo, diary entry, letter.
Victorian Era	The time when Queen Victoria was the queen of the United Kingdom. From 1837 to 1901.
Timeline	A list of important events arranged in the order in which they happened.

Victorian Schools	Schools in living memory	Schools now
Lessons focussed on reading, writing and arithmetic.	Chalkboards were still used and technology was beginning to be found in classrooms.	We learn to read write and do maths but we also learn other subjects like history and art.
Girls learnt how to sew, boys were taught woodwork.	Boys and girls learnt together.	Girls and boys always learn together.
