Simple Printmaking (printmaking, collage, drawing)



Star Words	Definition
print	To transfer a design to a surface.
rubbing	An impression of a texture onto paper by rubbing a crayon over it.
relief print	A print made from creating a design on a surface, leaving the raised image to be printed.
texture	The feel or appearance of a surface.
collage	Art made by sticking various different materials onto a backing.

- Create rubbings from natural objects found outside and interesting textures in the house.
- Have a go at printing with fruit and vegetables to make patterns.
- Use the Pattern template in 2Paint a Picture in Purple Mash to create patterns from a print.

Sticky Knowledge

Objects and body parts can be used to make prints. Prints can also be made from printing plates.

A foam plate can be made by cutting into the foam to make an image to print from.

Pieces of foam can be cut out and added to a plate to create a raised image to print from.

The print created from a plate is a mirror image of the plate.

Prints can be added to by drawing or cut up and used to create collages.

Key Concepts

- We can make a “plate” from which to “print”.
- There is a relationship between plate and print: e.g. negative / positive.
- We can use print to create “multiples”.
- We can explore line, shape, colour and texture to explore pattern, sequence, symmetry and intention.
