Ball	An object we can throw, catch or hit.
Partner	Someone you play and work with.
Roll	To move a ball along the floor.
Hit	To tap or strike a ball.
Ready	Prepared to move.

Sticky Knowledge

Net and wall games involve sending and receiving a ball with a partner. In this unit, children will learn to track and stop a ball, send a ball to a partner and move safely in space. Children will begin to use bats and balls, work cooperatively and take turns fairly in games.



I can hit a large ball with my hands.
Watch the ball carefully.
Push the ball towards a partner or space.



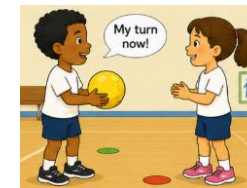
I can push a ball along the floor using a racket or bat.
Keep the ball on the floor.
Push gently using the racket or bat.



I can send and stop a ball.
Send the ball carefully.
Stop the ball using my hands or feet.



I can use a ready position before hitting or receiving.
Bend my knees slightly.
Keep my hands or bat ready.



I can take turns and play safely with others.
Wait for my turn.
Keep space between others.



I can play cooperatively with a partner using a balloon or ball.
Tap or send the ball gently.
Try to keep the ball moving together.

Home Learning Ideas

Net and Wall Games

What you need: two players, a soft ball or balloon and a racket or your hand.

How to play:

- Use a space in your home or garden.
- Hit or roll the ball to your partner.
- Your partner sends the ball back to you.
- Try to keep the ball going with your partner.
- Use your hand or a racket to hit the ball.
- Move to the side or forward to get the ball.
- Take turns to serve or start.
- See how many times you can keep the rally going!
