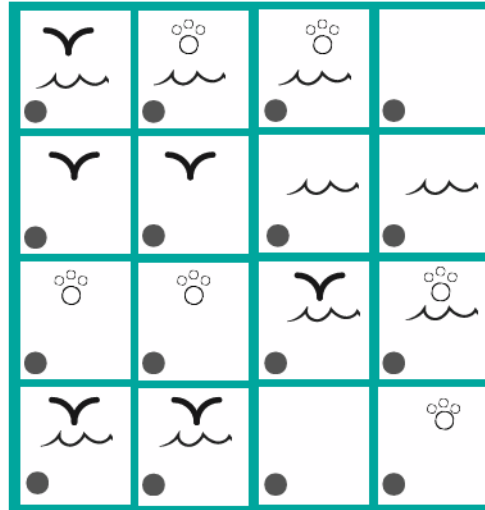

Sticky Knowledge

In 19th century Victorian Britain, the accessibility and speed of railway transport meant that people could quickly travel to the seaside. Coastal towns like Blackpool, Scarborough, Weston-Super-Mare and Brighton quickly grew into popular holiday resorts. To attract visitors, lots of seaside towns built entertainment facilities such as theatres, puppet shows and piers. Music such as 'I Do Like to Be Beside the Seaside', 1907 was composed to speak of the writer's love for the seaside and his wish to return there for his summer holidays each year.
